IN HAND CLASSES

Classes 2/4/5/7/8/9 are qualifiers for NPS/Equestrian Marketplace M&M in hand National Championship

Class 1 Senior Condition & Turnout - For ponies 4 years & over need not be registered, conformation will not be considered, to be judged purely on presentation of pony & handler. Ponies to be shown in hand. **(Sponsored by Grace & Robert Bisset).**

Class 2 Mares 4 years & over barren or with foal at foot- Ponies must be registered. The class will be split by age if sufficient entries. THE PINKERY TROPHY for best mare. **(Sponsored by Kebroyd Stud).** Qualifier for NPS/Equestrian Marketplace M&M in hand National Championship

Class 3 Foals- out of a mare shown in class 2 and by a licensed registered Exmoor stallion

Class 4 Stallion & Gelding 4 years & over – Ponies must be registered & stallions must be licensed and wear a stallion bridle disc. This class will be split by age if sufficient entries. DHOWAL CUP for Best Stallion. MARLYN BALIVANICH trophy for Best Gelding. **(Sponsored by Ali Macaulay)** Qualifier for NPS/Equestrian Marketplace M&M in hand National Championship

Class 5 Veteran Pony In Hand – Ponies to be registered and aged 16yrs & over **(sponsored by Lucie Stockdale in Memory of Veronica Watkins).** Qualifier for NPS/Equestrian Marketplace M&M in hand National Championship

Senior Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 2, 4 & 5 are eligible to compete. MOUNT LOTHIAN CUP. Champion & Reserve qualify for EPS Exmoor pony of the Year final 2019 **(Sponsored by Clunie & Melville)**

Class 6 Young stock Condition & Turnout - For ponies 3 years & under need not be registered, conformation will not be considered, to be judged purely on presentation of pony & handler. **(Sponsored by Halley Horse Feeds).**

Class 7 Yearling – Colt, filly or gelding registered ponies only. Qualifier for NPS/Equestrian Marketplace M&M in hand National Championship

Class 8 2 year old – Colt, filly or gelding registered ponies only, colts to be bitted and wearing a bridle disc. Qualifier for NPS/Equestrian Marketplace M&M in hand National Championship

Class 9 3 year old – Colt, filly or gelding, registered ponies only, colts to be bitted and wearing a bridle disc. Qualifier for NPS/Equestrian Marketplace M&M in hand National Championship

Young stock Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 3, 7-9 are eligible to enter. Champion to receive the ALEMOOR QUAICH. Young stock Champion & Reserve qualify for EPS Exmoor pony of the Year final 2019. **(Sponsored by Lizzie Raspin)**.

Overall In-Hand Championship - Winners of the Senior and Youngstock Championship to compete for the NPS/Kilmannan Stud M&M In Hand Silver Medal Rosette **(Sponsored by Fiona Dickson)**, and Exmoor Pony Society Silver Medal.

RIDDEN CLASSES

Class 10 Lead Rein Pony - Ponies must be registered, ridden in a snaffle bridle with lead rein attached to the nose band. Rider to be 8 years and under on the day of the show. No stallions in this class. JACK SPARROW SHIELD for the Winner. **(Sponsored by Grace & Robert Bisset)**. QUALIFIER FOR THE NPS/SHOWING CLASSICS M&M LEADING REIN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 11 Childs Ridden Pony - Registered ponies only & rider to be 14 years or under on the day of the show. Ponies will be required to canter together. No Stallions in this class. THE POSH CUP for the winner. **(Sponsored by Mousie Moorland Trust)**. QUALIFIER FOR THE NPS/RYEHOUSE NATIVE SHOW TEAM M&M JUNIOR RIDDEN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Class 12 Novice Ridden Pony - Registered ponies only, not to have won a first prize in an open class before 1st January 2019; to be show in snaffle bridle. **(Sponsored by Jacqueline Dow)**. QUALIFIER FOR THE NPS/PICTON M&M NOVICE RIDDEN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP.

Class 13 Open Ridden Pony - Ponies must be registered. **(Sponsored by Lynda Mulholland)** QUALIFIER FOR THE NPS/RINGSIDE STUD M&M OPEN RIDDEN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP.

Class 14 Family Ridden Pony- Pony to be ridden by an adult and a child (16yrs or under) (child can be lead rein). Pony need not be registered. Winner not eligible for ridden championship but is eligible for the performance championship. SKELBO CUP for winner **(Sponsored by Kareen Kidd)**.

Ridden Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 10-13 are eligible. WHITEBRIDGE SHIELD. Ridden Champion & Reserve qualify for EPS Ridden Exmoor pony of the Year final 2019. **(Sponsored by Clunie & Melville)**.

NPS/Standinghat Stud & Show Team M&M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette to the Ridden Champion (excluding leading rein) **(Sponsored by Gail Whetter)**.

OTHER CLASSES

- Class 15 Bred in Scotland** – Any age or sex registered pony. GLEN ALBYN QUAICH for the winner. **(Sponsored by Stewart Ednie)**.
- Class 16 Bred outside of Scotland-** Any age or sex registered pony.
- Class 17 Young Handler-** Ponies need not be registered. The handler's skill & ring craft to be judged not the pony's conformation. Handlers to be 16yrs or under on the day of the show. BEINN STROME JUNIOR HANDLER AWARD TROPHY to winner **(Sponsored by Kim Miller)**.
- Class 18 Related pairs** - Ponies need to be registered and class can be entered on the day.

Handy pony classes- will be run alongside the In-Hand Classes.

- Class 19 Handy Pony Ridden** - Ponies need not be registered. Ponies can be entered more than once but must have a different rider each time. STAIGER CUP for best ridden handy pony. **(Sponsored by Sheena Clifford)**.
- Class 20 Handy pony in hand** – Ponies 4 years and over. Ponies can be entered more than once but must have a different handler each time. IN HAND HANDY PONY MEMORIAL TROPHY CARN NAN ABRACH 2009-2017 to the winner **(Sponsored by Sheena Clifford)**.
- Class 21 Handy Pony In Hand** - Ponies under 4 years old need not be registered. Ponies can be entered more than once but must have a different handler each time. **(Sponsored by Sheena Clifford)**.

Supreme Championship – Young stock champion & reserve, senior champion & reserve & ridden champion & reserve to compete for the SCORRAIG TROPHY. There will also be a portrait done by Jane Wills for the Supreme Winner. **(Sponsored by Jen McLaren)**.

Performance Championship – SCOTTISH SHOW TANKARD

Points will be awarded for classes 10-14 & 19 based on places as follows: - 1st 6 pts, 2nd 5 pts, 3rd 4 pts, 4th 3pts, 5th 2pts and 1 point for taking part but unplaced. **(Sponsored by Jo Heslop)**.

Stabling

Stabling will be available at the venue at the following costs.

5pm-5pm next day (including 2 bales of shavings) are £35.

Day Stables (including a scattering of shavings) are £20.

Hay can either be purchased from the venue or bring your own.

Scottish Area Exmoor Pony Society Show rules – 2019

1. The show is held under the auspices of the Exmoor Pony Society and its rules and regulations must be abided by.
2. All colts and stallions 2 years and over **MUST** be bitted and wear a stallion bridle disc and entire males aged 4 years and over must be in possession of either a breed society or Defra licence.
3. Any pony not under proper control or showing signs of contagious disease will be asked to leave the show ground.
4. The judge's decision is final in all classes; objections are not encouraged as it is a fun show to promote the breed. If complaints must be made, they should be made to the secretary of the show within 30 minutes of the incident that is being complained about and be accompanied by a £50 deposit which will be donated to the EPS.
5. Equine Flu vaccinations are compulsory and must be up to date and not given within 7 days of show.
6. The show organisers, owners of the site or any other official will not accept any responsibility for any loss, damage etc. to any of the exhibitors possessions or animals. It is recommended that all exhibitors have appropriate third party insurance and exhibit at their own risk.
7. Dogs are welcome on the show ground but **MUST be kept on a lead at all times** and any dog droppings must be picked up.
8. Entries close on the 26th August 2019, and entry fee for each entry is £5 per class. Entries on the day may be accepted depending on the numbers forward but only if these ponies are already in the catalogue, i.e. it may be possible to enter extra classes on the day if you and your pony are already entered. Late entry fee will be £8.
9. Catalogues should be paid for in advance as only a small number of extras will be printed, pre-paid catalogues will be attached to back numbers to be collected on morning of show or can be emailed out. Numbers to be collected at show.
10. Classes may be amalgamated or split depending on the number of entries.
11. Please remember to bring your pony's passport as required by the passport legislation.

NPS Qualifying Rounds, Breed Show Rules: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-breds are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members and at breed shows ponies can qualify for finals even if their owners are not members. Owners of qualified ponies must become adult Qualifying or Life members to enter the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from August 2020.

The highest placed pony, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships, Breed Show Rules: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. At breed shows Silver Medals may be won by non-members. The owner of the qualified pony must become an Adult Qualifying or Life member to enter the final. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in either the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in Malvern, or at the Championship Show in Scotland. Qualifiers may only compete in one Silver Medal final.

The day is intended as a mix of serious showing and a fun social day so please do bring a packed lunch, or make use of the on site café, and use this opportunity to meet other like-minded Exmoor pony enthusiasts. Most of all have a fun day and let's hope the weather is kind.
